COUNT ON YOUR SUCCESS — CONSIDER CAREERS IN HUMAN SERVICES

Do you have a passion for improving the lives of others? If helping people lights a fire in your heart, then a career in Human Services may be right up your alley. Human Services is a broadly defined term that encompasses numerous ways to meet human needs. Direct service systems and creating accessibility to direct services are the main objectives of this career cluster.

Professionals in this field may work in many settings including community-based settings, offices, clinics, faith-based organizations, institutional settings, salons, and more. Human Services professionals and paraprofessionals are the heart of society, allowing humanity to not only survive, but thrive mentally, emotionally, spiritually, and even physically to create healthier and safer homes and communities.

Human Services professionals are responsible for caring for people by tending to psychological, physical, social, spiritual, and emotional needs of individuals and groups. These needs may be met through mental health counseling, rehabilitation, working in spas or barber shops, daycare centers, nail salons, government agencies, colleges and universities, hospitals and health clinics, churches and temples, emergency shelters and groups homes, just to name a few.

Career pathways to success in this cluster include working in Consumer Services, such as being an Employee Benefits Representative, Event Specialist or Customer Service Representative; Counseling or Mental Health Services such as a Marriage and Family Therapist, Vocational Rehabilitation Counselor or Psychologist; Early Childhood Development and Services such as a Nanny, Childcare Facility Director or Elementary School Counselor; Family and Community Services such as a Geriatric Service Worker, Volunteer Coordinator or Religious Leader; or Personal Care Services such as an Esthetician, Personal Trainer, Mortician, Home Care Aide or Barber.

THE HUMAN SERVICES CAREER CLUSTER

Career clusters are tools to help you decide where to focus your education and training as you formulate and then act on your career goals. They organize what you learn in school around specific professional fields, such as information technology, health sciences and finance.

The Human Services Cluster is divided into five majors, each based on groups of professions requiring similar talents, aptitudes, and skills.

These five majors are Early Childhood Development and Services, Counseling and Mental Health Services, Family and Consumer Services, Personal Care Services and Consumer Services. They all involve working with people to help improve their lives. People working in these areas include childcare workers, substance abuse and behavioral disorder counselors, consumer advocates, social services workers, and massage therapists.

Careers in the Human Services cluster have seen a shift in technological needs and innovation in recent years. Those changes include mobile device support for real time receipt of information and alerts, digital forms and documents, paperless processes along with automated workflows, central data repositories to support collaboration and knowledge sharing between individuals and agencies, and cloud-based case management systems to match demand growth for agencies' services.

HUMAN SERVICES PATHWAYS – CONSUMER SERVICES/COUNSELING AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES/EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT AND SERVICES/FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SERVICES/PERSONAL CARE SERVICES

A wide variety of positions are essential in each of the five major Human Services areas.

- » **Consumer Services** Consumer Services professionals combine communications skills with the product or service knowledge to provide accurate recommendations on products and services.
- » Counseling and Mental Health Services Professionals use communication skills to interface effectively with referral sources including the legal system and study group dynamics to identify functions and effects of larger and smaller groups on personal effectiveness.
- » Early Childhood Development and Services Service professionals have the responsibility of listening respectfully and attentively to children, parents, and staff members to collect input concerning a child's development, general child development, and current issues in the program or classroom. Individuals then communicate the often-complex issues surrounding early childcare in ways that can be easily understood by creating an inviting atmosphere in which to work.
- » Family and Community Services Practitioners recognize concerns and assist individuals to make informed decisions about their needs. They work with many different community resources to gain a broad awareness of available help, to research and use state and local social service providers to expand their resource base, and to communicate with a family to gain family support.
- » **Personal Care Services** Personal Care Service Professionals enjoy working and interacting with people and get satisfaction from doing an excellent job for their customers and catering to the needs of others.

INDIVIDUALS THEN COMMUNICATE THE OFTEN-COMPLEX ISSUES SURROUNDING EARLY CHILDCARE IN WAYS THAT CAN BE EASILY UNDERSTOOD BY CREATING AN INVITING ATMOSPHERE IN WHICH TO WORK.
